

Dining Room

Face to Face joined the City of Philadelphia, SEPTA and Project HOME collaboration to address the staggering problem with food insecurity in center city. Hub of Hope, located in the concourse of Suburban Station, offers a hot meal, shower services and case management. Face to Face provided approximately 200 meals on the first Friday of every month.

Your support served nutritious meals to people experiencing hunger in center city.

On July 2, 2019, our free, Fresh Choice Market was launched. The popular weekly market further encouraged healthy eating and supplemented guests' nutritional needs. Thanks to our partnership with Carversville Farm Foundation, guests chose from seasonal fresh, organic produce, and eggs. Nutrition information and recipes were included which prompted recipe sharing and community building conversations.

With your help, guest enjoyed fresh, organic produce at home.







Health Center

In October 2018, a monthly pharmacy clinic began to assist guests with questions they had regarding their medicines. The pharmacist reviewed medication lists, counseled guests on how to take their medicine, cautioned about potential side effects, and encouraged adherence.

In January 2019, Sister MaryAnn Woodward, RN, from the Daughters of Charity, joined the health center 3 days a week. Her addition allowed the health center to operate with 150% more hours and expanded health services to our guests. It also increased collaborations with the legal center and social services.

Health Fair March 2019

A community health fair was held on March 30, 2019, with over 30 vendors in the gym. Cohosted with the Junior League of Philadelphia, guests received various health screenings and valuable information on strategies to improve their health.

Because of your compassion, the health center was able to expand its services.

Legal Center

Criminal Record Expungement Clinic

Criminal records, even non-convictions, can restrict access to housing, employment, education, public assistance, and voting. On October 13, 2018, Face to Face Legal Center hosted its first Criminal Record Expungement Clinic. Because of your support, multiple clinics were held over the year and resulted in 302 petitions filed for 58 guests.

Your generosity helped several guests get jobs after their criminal records were expunged.



Social Services

A weekly behavioral health group was started in September 2018 to address the chronic mental health issues our guests struggle with every day. Facilitated by a licensed therapist, guests gather to share personal experiences and coping strategies.
